Audubon Wetlands Preserve 1 2 3

This 109 acre park, bordering the Jerome Fork of the Mohican River, has a number of different kinds of wetlands, including burr reed marsh, buttonbush swamp, vernal pools, and floodplain forest. A 270 ft boardwalk spans the burr reed marsh, allowing easy access.

Gilliom-Cherp Nature Park 1 2 3

This 176 acre park primarily consists of floodplain forest along the Black Fork of the Mohican River. There are a number of vernal pools and small open marshes found throughout the forest. This will be a primary opportunity to look for active salamanders.

Black Fork Bottoms 1 2 3

The Black Fork Bottoms Hunting Area contains several habitats, including swamp forest, marsh, grassland and upland forest. We'll concentrate on the high quality swamp and its plants. The park is located within the flood plain of the Black Fork of Mohican River.
